Nevertheless, any at-risk UK National living in Spain is eligible to receive IOM's support

IOM Spain will provide direct individual support to UKNs to help with their residency applications, through a phone helpline, email or face-to-face case support.

Our legal advisors and caseworkers will provide advice both in English and Spanish.

Outreach and information events will be held in the Spanish regions where the project is implemented.

Informational materials with legal residency requirements and processes will be made available through various channels (e.g. social media, brochures, etc.).

Following the United Kingdom's departure from the European Union, the British Government has created the UK Nationals Support Fund (UKNSF) aiming to provide support to those UK Nationals living in the European Union.

In this context and running from February 2020 until March 2021, IOM is implementing a joint project engaging IOM missions across multiple EU Member States including France, Spain, Poland, Slovakia, Germany, Italy and Portugal in close cooperation with IOM UK, UK FCO and UK embassies.

Support will be targeted to reach UKNs and their family members that may be at risk or with difficulties to complete their residency process. This can include elderly people with limited mobility, people living with different disabilities, or chronic illness, people who face language or literacy barriers, or barriers in accessing technology. The objective of the UKNSF Project is to provide direct support to UK Nationals residing in EU/EFTA countries, and their family members, that are looking to maintain their residency in the mentioned Member States after the UK has left the EU.

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
